They just don't have enough says Sherese Slaughter Haynes, a family service worker with Butler County Success. She says they are always grateful, thankful to have a hand up as they are working, trying their best to provide just enough.

She is talking about the families of preschoolers who are on the BackPack program, receiving enough food to get their child through the weekend. Sometimes this means that the food meant for one is shared among many siblings. For some, the BackPack program gives that extra amount of food, so rather than skip meals so their kids can eat, parents are confident they can have a meal too.

Who among us wouldn't sacrifice our own comfort to ensure our children had enough? In my family, we had the 'hold back' rule for get togethers – the adult family members would 'hold back' filling their plates until we were sure all the children and other guests had enough to eat. But we knew there was a 'fall back' and there would be food for us, if not at the gathering, at home. When there is no food in the cupboard, the families on our BackPack program don't have this 'fall back' option, only the 'hold back' one because as Sherese says, "...they just don't have enough."

The BackPack program gives these kids just enough to help them thrive, providing the fuel they need to have a chance at success. And as we've seen, these simple bags of food give the parents comfort because there is just enough to get their child through the weekend without an empty belly.

We could not provide the BackPack Program without the support of our community, giving your time, talent and treasure. Please consider helping us distribute tens of thousands of food bags this school year to students right here at home. If you are more hands on, we always need volunteers to help assemble the food bags. If you don't have time, consider a gift: \$5 sponsors one child for the weekend, \$19 sponsors a child for a month and \$150 provides for a child for the school year. 
