

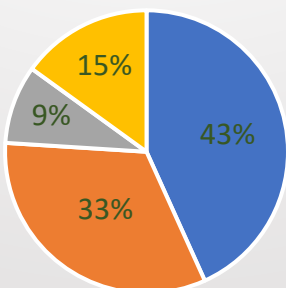
National Guard

BACKPACK PROGRAM

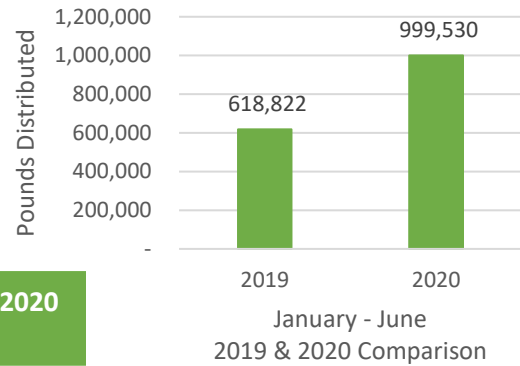

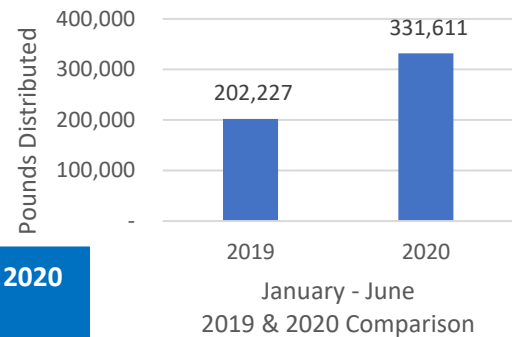

Between Jan and Jun 2020, our network of pantries served **128,079** families comprised of **482,583** people.

Compared to 26,130 families and 76,484 people served during the same period in 2019.

In effort to serve more people and reduce the risk of exposure, most pantries have adopted the drive through food distribution model, suspending the favored CHOICE pantry model where individuals can select their own food preferences. This is a temporary solution until the demand decreases, and the pandemic is no longer a threat.
